

Spring Term 2022 Series on John's Gospel

Matthew, Mark and Luke (the synoptic gospels) tell the story of Jesus in a similar way, whereas John is written differently. The Gospel of John is written theologically rather than chronologically! This means that John doesn't go through Jesus' life in the historical order in which events happen, but rather he structures his Gospel to make important points about the identity of Jesus as the Son of God. The themes of 'light' and 'life' come across strongly throughout the Gospel, which is why we felt these would be significant themes for our Christmas services. In fact, John summarises his whole purpose of writing his Gospel at the very end in 20:31 'these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name'. Perhaps this can be our prayer for all those who preach and listen to this series on the Gospel of John over the coming months.

Since John has structured his Gospel in this way, we are going to follow his lead and explore the Gospel using the signposts he gives. The number '7' is theologically significant in scripture as it symbolises 'completeness' or 'perfection' because the world was created in seven days. John uses the number '7' to point to the divine identity of Jesus by recording 7 Signs, which demonstrate His divine power, and 7 'I am' Statements which were spoken declarations of Jesus' divinity. We are going to unpack these two sets of seven to deepen our understanding of who Jesus is, so that we may have life in his name!

7 Signs	7 'I am' Statements
1. Wedding in Cana	1. I am the Bread of Life
2. Healing of the Official's son	2. I am the Light of the World
3. Healing at the pool	3. I am the Gate
4. Feeding the five thousand	4. I am the Good Shepherd
5. Walking on water	5. I am the Resurrection and the Life
6. Healing the man born blind	6. I am the Way, the Truth and the Life
7. Raising of Lazarus	7. I am the True Vine

Generally, the 'signs' come before the 'I am statements', but there are a few occasions when John mixes them up and also links them. For example, the 'Bread of Life' comes shortly after 'Feeding of the five thousand'; and the 'Light of the World' comes just before 'Healing of the man born blind'. Therefore, we've tried to reflect these variations in the way we've broken up John's Gospel this term. We've also allowed for the first Sunday each

month to be a 'break' from the series for Café Church at the 10.30; and the 'Sovereignty of God' series at the 9am.
