

Updates and Horizons September 2023



Recently, our ordinand, Karen Wheatley, visited Lille (home of mission

partners CENTRE DE LA RÉCONCILIATION) Lille is a large multicultural city in the very north of France, close to the Belgian border. It was here, just a 1 hour 20-minute train ride from London, that I spent a week in August. Lille's Église La Réconcilation (Baptiste), pastored by Christian de la Roque, has a significant social justice ministry with young under-age migrants. St Paul's Church began to build links with them back in 2017. They are hugely grateful for the financial and prayer support that we have given them over the years. Many of the young people arrive with no papers and are therefore not taken in by the French authorities unless they are either clearly children or clearly adults. Those in the 13-17 age-bracket can sometimes fall through the net and this is where the work of the Centre de la Réconciliation, comes into its own. The young people are supported in lodgings and given education and advocacy services to obtain the necessary paperwork for France.

I took the opportunity while in Lille to visit the *Centre de la Réconciliation's Maison Esther*, which is a hostel lodging around a dozen young people, mostly of sub-Saharan African origin, who would otherwise find themselves undefended on the streets. *Maison Esther* is an old farmhouse, undergoing major renovations to upgrade it to modern standards. All the while the boys are living there. They have been helping with the renovations during the

summer holidays, learning new skills. I took the opportunity on my visit to do a few hours gardening, clearing away a

hedge that was blocking access to a door.

But aside from the work with the refugees, I was mainly in the city to engage in a mission with the local Churches Together. It was all based around offering the citizens *Barbecues Géants* (Giant Barbecues) for 4 days. Well established for more than 20 years, this annual event makes the most of the long-lunch culture of the French people to reach citizens for Christ. Whilst there would be few restrictions to this in the UK, in France the culture is spiritually quite different. There is a strong philosophy that public life

Here they moved into international roles. Stuart has trained as a counsellor and has a private practice and well as serving in pastoral care roles with mission workers sent from the UK and Latin

Dear St Paul's family,

We are writing on Day 4 of our 10 days of Prayer and Fasting at Gold Hill Baptist Church at Chalfont St Peter, and already there is a sense of change and expectation amongst us as we intentionally come together to seek God and wait to listen to what God wants to say to us as a community of believers. The 10 days meetings are part of 387 other physical gatherings registered across 68 countries. The 10 days virtual (on zoom) has over 300 registered with prayer leaders representing 30+ nations, with 120 hours out of the 240 hours with children leading th e prayers.



We are also very encouraged to have had time last week to share with Rev'd Alex and learn more about how God is leading St Paul's into "new things" and ways that we haven't travelled before. God is clearly encouraging His church to make disciples that multiply across our communities and to take us out of our comfort zones to use the gifts He has given us to share the love of Jesus with our neighbours.

Jenny is getting ready for the long-awaited *Ethne Global Gathering** to be held in November. They last met in December 2018. This meeting will be equipping and envisioning local pastors, mission leaders and partners to support and implement disciple making principles amongst the remaining peoples and places around the world who still don't know who Jesus is. Jenny will be leading the prayer teams (onsite and virtual) together with the local national prayer network that has hundreds of prayer groups and towers of prayer for the nations. (Let Jenny know if you would like to join the virtual prayer team*).

Stuart had a busy August attending an International Conference, where he was helping coordinate sessions on staff care and wellbeing. He was part of a team coordinating a group of 80 psychologists, counsellors and pastoral coaches. It was a joy to see some workers' families receive care from a multidisciplinary team of counsellors and psychologists. Stuart is now involved in working through the outcomes of various meetings. He is also returning to his private counselling practice as well as being involved in supporting Latin Americans and others who are involved in some of the most challenging parts of the world.

Thank you for your continued interest and support as we work to further God's Kingdom around the world amongst people who have limited or no access to know about Jesus. /...

STOP PRESS

This ethnic violence in Manipur, north east India, has only just been brought to our attention. Karen Wheatley was at a study weekend with Kailean Khonsai who was until September 2022, reserve manager of Wolf Fields, an urban nature reserve at Southhall, owned by A Rocha. We have had several visits to Wolf Fields – a truly amazing multi cultural and yet Christian area abounding with wild life. Kailean is now an Ordinand on the same course as Karen.

His homeland of Manipur has suffered devastating violence against the local Christians, with many killed, homes and churches burnt to the ground and thousands displaced. Kailean's wife's parents have escaped to the UK, but his own family is scattered.

He gave Karen the poster (left) to pass on to St Paul's family. While of course he is raising funds for humanitarian aid, what he has specifically asked for is prayer.
