***'What does this book from the Bible mean for us today?'***

Micah – “Who is like Yahweh?”

He was around during the reigns of Jotham, Ahaz and Hezekiah (742 – 687 BC) so possibly a younger contemporary of Isaiah.

**1:1-3:12      Foretells of terrible times to come**

**4:1-5:15      Hope will overcome**

**6:1-7:20      speaks of judgement and hope**

**Micah is confident of his call to speak out:**

3:8      But as for me, I am filled with power,  
with the Spirit of the LORD,  
and with justice and might,  
to declare to Jacob his transgression,  
to Israel his sin.

**Micah leaves us in no doubt what God asks of us:**

6:6-8      With what shall I come before the LORD  
and bow down before the exalted God?  
Shall I come before him with burnt offerings,  
with calves a year old?  
<sup>7</sup> Will the LORD be pleased with thousands of rams,  
with ten thousand rivers of oil?  
Shall I offer my firstborn for my transgression,  
the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?  
<sup>8</sup> He has shown you, O mortal, what is good.  
And what does the LORD require of you?  
***To act justly and to love mercy  
and to walk humbly with your God.***
